All Staff and Cadets have a duty to report **all** hazards, incidents, injuries and near misses and to act in a safe manner at all times.

AAFC Staff must also take all reasonably practicable steps to protect the health and safety of all persons, by implementing effective risk management processes for all AAFC activities.

These safety responsibilities are not negotiable.

AAFCSafe is the program designed to guide us through the effective management of risks in planning for and the conduct of AAFC activities.

I, the Staff and Cadets, are committed to implementing and embedding AAFCSafe into 314 Squadron.

I know I have your continued commitment to a safe, challenging, adventurous and fun environment at 314 Squadron.
